	• Article VIII Miscellaneous: Changing the word "potential" to "perceived." Article VIII Section 2: verify that CEC members are the only members able to amend by-laws. Section 3: Adding that all records retention is for seven years. Section 5: Completely remove the dissolution option/information within the by-laws. Monte: Do we have any contractual obligations that would cause issues with the dissolved ability of the coalition? Kendall: if the coalition were to dissolve, the two Meridian Police
